From the Main Gate, turn right onto Woodside Plantation Drive.



Follow Woodside Plantation Drive for one mile to Steeplechase Drive and turn left onto Steeplechase Drive - it's just before you get to the Reserve Club.



Follow Steeplechase 1.7 miles until you get to Anderson Mill Road and turn left onto Anderson Mill Road. If you get to the back gate, you've gone too far.

Anderson Mill is just before the gate.



Go 1/4 mile on Anderson Mill and look for the sign that says "Bristlecone Ridge."



The Butterfly Park is in the Bristlecone Ridge neighborhood - look for the white gazebo.
