Chilled Sweet Corn Soup with Crab

About 6 Servings

INGREDIENTS

8 ears fresh Sweet Corn, shucked

1 tbsp Butter

4 oz Yellow Onion, diced (1 small onion)

2 ea Garlic Cloves, smashed

4 cups Chicken Broth

½ cup Heavy Cream

8 oz Lump Crab Meat

½ cup Creme Fraiche

1 tsp Old Bay Seasoning

Chives, sliced thin

Olive Oil

Diced Avocado

Cherry Tomato

As the weather turns up the heat, try this fun spin on Gazpacho using carrot as the base:

DIRECTIONS

1. Cut the kernels for the Corn cobs. Reserve a few tablespoons for garnish later, if you wish.
2. In a pot, sweat the Onion and Garlic in Butter over medium heat until soft and translucent.
3. Add Corn, Broth, and Corn cobs and simmer for 20-30 minutes.
4. Remove and discard cobs.
5. Blend the ingredients until smooth.
6. Strain through a fine mesh sieve.
7. Stir in Creme and Lime. Season with Salt and Pepper to taste.

8. Chill completely and hold up to 3 days for service.

When time to serve:

1. Mix the Creme Fraiche with the Old Bay.
2. Portion the chilled Soup into the service containers.
3. Top with a dollop of Creme Fraiche, fresh Lump Crab, reserved Corn, Avocado, Olive Oil, and Chives.

- 1 - 2 oz Cranberry Juice
- Garnish with Lemon and Cherry

1. Combine ingredients in a shaker.
2. Add ice and shake vigorously for 10–15 seconds until chilled.
3. Serve over ice.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy summer! The weather certainly kept us on our toes this month as we move from drought conditions to rains only Noah could appreciate late in the month. As of this writing, we have had 5 consecutive days of inch or more rains, and more on the way. While it is great to see the ponds and lakes refilled, the impact on the maintenance team is intense as we work to repair damaged bunkers and clean up after each deluge. The good news is that the bermudagrass has finally started to grow and the poa annua is starting to die! The bad news is that it is difficult to get the mowers out when it is this wet, so please be patient as we work.

With the month of June comes aeration on the Reserve (Nicklaus) Course. This year, we are closing the course for 10 days, from June 8 – 17. This will be the only aeration we do on the course this year. In addition, we apply our bulk fertilizer on both courses beginning June 8. Because we cannot aerify fairways after the fertilizer is spread, we will begin the process on Nicklaus fairways beginning the week of June 1. I'm sorry for any inconvenience this poses, however this is the most important fertilization of the year, and it must be done correctly. Just as a reminder, the Hollow Creek aeration is scheduled for July 6 – 15.

During May, we replaced all of the flags and flagsticks on both of our golf courses, providing a better aesthetic for you, the Members. In addition, the crystals for range finders are embedded in the base of the stick, providing an easier target. It seems the new flags are a hit, as we continue to experience flags being stolen off the course – most recently on #17 of Hollow Creek. While this seems like a minor infraction, it does cost the Club to replace them. If you have any information on who is responsible, please let me know.

Also, I have observed that someone is moving gold tee markers or discarding them totally. We have recently witnessed this on #1 of Hollow Creek, where the markers were tossed in the adjacent woods. On #7 Hollow Creek, the markers were moved forward 50 yards, making the hole shorter. This activity negatively impacts events and matches, which depend on accurate distances for the purpose of handicaps. Please do not alter the placement of tee markers!

Finally, we have completed a number of “course beautification” projects on the Nicklaus course, including #3 next to the green, #7 above the bunker and next to the green, and #17 next to the tee boxes. In addition, we continue to address areas around the clubhouse and the racquets complex. The pond expansion next to #10 tee box on Hollow Creek is underway, and we are awaiting a part to complete the pond structure, so it can be filled with water, completing the project.
